



Consider the AMCP Foundation in Your Estate Planning

We hope you'll consider including a gift to the AMCP Foundation in your will or living trust. Called a charitable bequest, this type of gift offers these main benefits:

- **Simplicity.** Just a few sentences in your will or trust are all that is needed.

The official bequest language for AMCP Foundation is: "I, [name], of [city, state, ZIP], give, devise and bequeath to the AMCP Foundation [written amount or percentage of the estate or description of property] for its unrestricted use and purpose."

- **Flexibility.** Because you are not actually making a gift until after your lifetime, you can change your mind at any time.
- **Versatility.** You can structure the bequest to leave a specific item or amount of money, make the gift contingent on certain events, or leave a percentage of your estate to us in support of our mission.
- **Tax Relief.** If your estate is subject to estate tax, your gift is entitled to an estate tax charitable deduction for the gift's full value.

To make a charitable bequest, you need a current will or revocable living trust. We recommend you consult with your legal or tax adviser.

Your gift can be made as a percentage of your estate. Or you can make a specific bequest by giving a certain amount of cash, securities or property. We understand that your circumstances may change and you can change your gift at any time.

After your lifetime, the AMCP Foundation receives your gift.
